### The River Thames in Tudor London



The River Thames was wider in Tudor London. It was very busy and used by boats and ships.

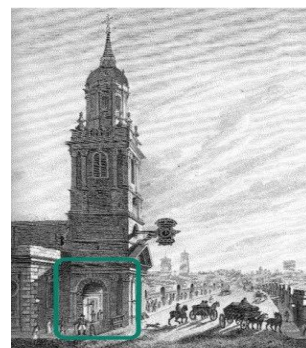
London Bridge was the only dry crossing over The Thames. Buildings were allowed on the bridge making it very cramped. After The Great Fire of London, buildings were not allowed on bridges.
